Mission

The mission of **COPF Services** is to provide emotional support and crisis intervention. This mission will be accomplished by maintenance of 24-hour telephone helplines, a website, a chat line and development of educational materials and programs.

Review of 2014

- We have strengthened our relationship with 211 referring to them as needed and utilizing their database as a reference thus improving information and referral services for our callers.
- We have begun to collaborate with other agencies for school presentations attempting to reduce duplication while providing mental health information and a framework for students to understand the relationship between drugs, alcohol and mental health. Grants were submitted for a new program to offer to area high schools.
- We have begun more outreach in the Greater Milwaukee area to case managers, group homes, hospitals and other agencies who could use our services.
- We have begun an internship program for masters and doctoral level students collaborating with Starting Point (where the students have direct contact with clients). We currently have 4 students, 1 from UWM, 1 from Concordia and 2 from Ottawa University who will be with us for a year.
- We have a regular column in the News Graphic, "How do I COPE with..."
- We continue to look for sustainable and new funding for the Hotline.
- We have actively recruited new Board members adding to the diversity and the skills of our Board.
- We will be starting a Strategic Plan with the Board this year to address the future of COPE.


